THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

The First Reading: Colossians 1: 15-20

The first reading is from the Epistle of St Paul to the Colossians, chapter 15, beginning at verse 15.

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶ for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created. things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹ For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, 20 and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

The Sermon

The Presentation

We welcome this child who comes to be baptized. I invite his sponsors to present him now.

We present Alexander Hunter Beatt to be baptized.

Shannon, Karen, Erin and Liam, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Alexander Hunter for baptism and answer on his behalf? By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage him in the life and faith of the Christian Community?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism this child begins his journey of faith.
You speak for him today.
Will you care for him and help him to take his place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?
With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? *I do*.

Do you then renounce the devil and all his works?

I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

The priest says to the whole congregation:
You have heard these our brothers
and sisters respond to Christ.
Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers:

We will support them.

The Baptism

The priest, Alexander Hunter, his family and godparents gather at the font and the priest begins the thanksgiving prayer.

Praise God who made heaven and earth.

Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

[Shortened version of the Blessing of the Water]

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life, and we thank you for the water of baptism.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, he may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may he walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen**.

The priest asks the parents and godparents:

Do you believe and accept the

Christian faith into which Alexander

Hunter is to be baptized?

I do.

The priest addresses the whole congregation: Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess, together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

[Using a shortened version of the Apostle's Creed in question-and-answer form]

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. Amen.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Alexander Hunter saying:

Alexander Hunter, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Alexander Hunter, saying:
Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.



Live as a disciple of Christ, fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen**.

The priest continues:

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the priest, saying:

We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

Presentation of Bible and Candle

The Churchwardens, on behalf of the parish, present Alex with a Children's Bible and a lit candle. The Bible is to help him to learn more about God and his Son Jesus Christ and to grow in his faith, and the candle symbolises the light of Christ, which has been passed down through the centuries and which is today extended to Alex, that he may shine forth the light of Christ throughout his life.

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we do as Christ your Son commanded:

we remember his passion and death, we celebrate his resurrection and ascension, and we look for the coming of his kingdom.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts, grant by the power of the life-giving Spirit that we may be made one in your holy Church and partakers of the body and blood of your Son, that he may dwell in us and we in him:

Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.
