The First Reading - Mark 10: 13-

The first reading is from the gospel according to Mark, chapter 10, beginning at verse 13.

13 People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. ¹⁴But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. ¹⁵Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' ¹⁶And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

<u>The Second Reading - The Gospel -</u> John 6: 51-58

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to St John, chapter 6, beginning at verse 51.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

⁵¹I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.'

52 The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' ⁵³So Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. ⁵⁴Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; ⁵⁵for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. ⁵⁶Those who

eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. ⁵⁸This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.'

The Sermon

The Presentation

We welcome these children who come to be baptized. I invite their sponsors to present them now.

Parents and godparents:

We present Lily Prendergast Sykes and Frederick Prendergast Sykes to be baptized.

Parents and godparents, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Lily Prendergast and Frederick Prendergast for baptism and answer on their behalf? By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage them in the life and faith of the Christian Community?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism these children begin their journey of faith. You speak for them today. Will you care for them and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? *I do*.

Do you then renounce the devil and all his works?

I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

The priest says to the whole congregation:
You have heard these our brothers
and sisters respond to Christ.
Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers:

We will support them.

The Baptism

The priest, Lily and Freddie, their family and godparents gather at the font and the priest begins the thanksgiving prayer.

Praise God who made heaven and earth.

Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

[Shortened version of the Blessing of the Water]

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life, and we thank you for the water of baptism.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The priest asks the parents and godparents:

Do you believe and accept the

Christian faith into which Freddie and

Lily are to be baptized?

I do.

The priest addresses the whole congregation:
Brothers and sisters, I ask you to
profess, together with these
candidates the faith of the Church.

[Using a shortened version of the Apostle's Creed in question-and-answer form.]

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. Amen.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Lily, saying:

Lily Prendergast, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Lily, saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Freddie, saying:

Frederick Prendergast, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Freddie, saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.



Live as disciples of Christ, fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen**.

The priest continues:

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the priest, saying:

We therefore receive and welcome you

as members with us of the body of Christ,

as children of the one heavenly Father,

and as inheritors of the kingdom of God.

Freddie and Lily are presented with gifts from the Parish of Children's Bibles and lit candles. The Bible is to help them to learn more about God and his Son Jesus Christ and to grow in their faith, and the candle symbolises the light of Christ, which has been passed down through the centuries and which is today extended to Lily and Freddie, that they may shine forth the light of Christ throughout their lives.
