O Lord, open our lips and our mouth shall proclaim your praise.


O God, make speed to save us.

The First Reading – Proverbs 22: 1– 2, 8–9, 22–23

The first reading is from the Book of Proverbs, chapter 22, beginning at verse 1.

22A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches,

and favour is better than silver or gold.

² The rich and the poor have this in common:

the Lord is the maker of them all.

⁸ Whoever sows injustice will reap calamity,

and the rod of anger will fail.

⁹ Those who are generous are blessed, for they share their bread with the poor.

²² Do not rob the poor because they are poor,

or crush the afflicted at the gate;

²³ for the Lord pleads their cause and despoils of life those who despoil them.

Here ends the First Reading.

Psalm - Hymn No. 494 (Beauty for

brokenness) [Verses 1-2]
Beauty for brokenness,
hope for despair,
Lord, in your suff'ring world
this is our prayer.
Bread for the children,
justice, joy, peace,
sunrise to sunset

<u>The Second Reading - Mark 7: 24-</u> <u>37</u>

The second reading is from the Gospel according to Mark, chapter 7, beginning at verse 24.

²⁴ From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, ²⁵but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. ²⁶Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' ²⁸But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' ²⁹Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' ³⁰So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

³¹ Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³²They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. ³⁴Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' ³⁵And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷They were astounded beyond measure, saying, 'He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak.'

Here ends the Second Reading.
