Lenten Challenge

Gillian is off again!

She is walking at least 5km every day of Lent 2024.

Wednesday 14th February – Saturday 30th March 2024

Lent is the season for examining ourselves and seeing how we can more fully reflect the life and love of Christ and his commandment to us to love our neighbour as ourselves. That means respecting and caring for others and for ourselves.

Therefore, again, this Lent, I am encouraging people to take up something that gives you a focus each day and that benefits you physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually.

This year, I am walking each day for my physical, mental, emotional and spiritual wellbeing and for the victims of the conflict between

Palestine and Israel. (channelled through the Bishops' Appeal to Christian Aid who are working on the ground with local agencies), and to assist with the rebuilding of Al-Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza which was founded and is managed by the Anglican Diocese of Jerusalem (which covers Jordan, Palestine, Lebanon, Syria and Israel). It is the only Christian hospital in the Gaza strip and the only cancer hospital in Gaza. It normally treats approximately 45,000 patients a year. Al-Ahli Hospital in Gaza welcomes all people regardless of their faith or background.
